PLEA FOR EXTRA JUDGES SOLICITOR-GENERAL AND AMENDMENT

A plea for the appointment of extra Judges to obviate delays in the High Court and Court of Appeal was made yesterday when a Commons Committee began consideration of the Administration of Justice (Appeals) Bill.
The main provisions of the Bill are that no appeal shall lie from the Court of Appeal to the House of Lords except with the leave of that Court or of the House of Lords; and that appeals from the decision of a County Court Judge shall go direct to the Court of Appeal.

Rogers at Liverpool Quarter Sessions yesterday when prosecuting Thomas Mann (39), of Bootle, who was charged with indecent assault.
He described what was alleged to have taken place when a youth of 16 went for a private bath. The youth said that Mann was a woman, and made a complaint to the police.

MESSAGE IN THE DUST

A Treasury note on the covering of a well and an eight-words message figured in dust reading, "I leave all my money to Evelyn, Dad," aroused the fears of a farmer when he went to inspect the body of Reginald Redwell (33), a naval stoker, of Lidlington, Bedfordshire, was brought to the surface. Redwell arrived home on Saturday on sick leave from H.M.S. Sussex. His sister's name is Evelyn, and it is believed that the money is meant for her.

SON ACQUITTED

John Anthony Devonshire (29), of Aspinall-street, was acquitted at Heywood Police Court yesterday of charges of unlawfully killing his father, John Devonshire (59), of the same address, on July 9.
It was stated that a post-mortem examination showed that the cause of death was cardiac failure due to the condition of the aortic valve. The father was angry about his daughter staying out late on the Sunday night, and the following day he quarrelled with his son. There was a struggle between them, which ended in the father falling on the floor, striking the stone flags with the back of his head.

PETROL IS DANGEROUS

Petrol should never be exposed except to the minutest extent in the house and it must never be thrown down a drain or sink. By doing a fatal explosion may result.
This warning is given in a Ministry of Health report on accidents in sewers, issued yesterday. The report points out that the use of petrol or similar liquids for cleaning purposes in private houses is growing and the practice of disposing of the petrol into drains cannot be too strongly deprecated.
