JOHNSON'S role to take notice of the great danger to which the Nation might be exposed to, in case of an invasion, from the great number of French Emigrants that were still fullered to remain in it. He had conferred with all ranks of people, both rich and poor, and the general voice of the Nation was with him, that it was dangerous to suffer these persons to continue in the Country.

DUNDAS said, concerning Emigrants, the number of those persons was not so great as had been supposed, and any Emigrant who might become an object of suspicion, would be immediately sent out of the Country, and the Alien Act.
