In so doing the Abbé has preserved his character of a fubble politician, for certainly a more feandalous and treacherous compact never was signed by a great sind powerful Monarch. The Cabinet of Vienna may now repent at leiture of its treachery. The price of all this degradation appears to be, that the Emperor should be permitted to feize on Venice and some other Italian towns, which the French took care to grafack set hel ald ducts, before they furrendered them to the Austrian troops.
