It was asserted, that the Commander of a French rivateer, captured by one of our cruiters, had communicated the arrival, before he left port, of official intelligence from the armies announcing the complete defeat of the Austrians in a general engagement, and that Prince Lightenslein and 5000 men had been taken prisoners; but our latest accounts from Holland are of the 28th ult. and had the issue of the hattle been so very favourable to France, the general statement, is not the details, would have been transmitted long since to this country.

The Dutch and German papers give circumstantial accounts of the numbers and positions of the respective armies.
