By the Dutch Mail, which arrived this morning, we have received a few particulars respecting the preparations now making by the French to evacuate Switzerland.

Letters from Amsterdam of the 15th, and from Geneva of the 17th inst. state, that according to intelligence from the General Government, the French troops at Nancy, has received orders from the French Minister of War, to repair immediately to the frontiers of Switzerland, and to assist the command of the French troops destined to enter Switzerland, for the purpose of restoring tranquillity in that country.

This General, in consequence of these orders, has already proceeded to the frontiers of Switzerland, and is expected to arrive there in a few days. Before his departure, he sent notice to several corps, forming the garrisons in Luxembourg, to proceed to the frontiers of Switzerland, and to assist the command of the French troops destined to enter Switzerland, for the purpose of restoring tranquillity in that country.

The above Mail brings intelligence from Ratisbon, that on the 21st inst. a new and important discovery was made in the possession of the Duke of Mantua, and several new measures of territorial distribution and appropriation. It gives up to the Duke of Mantua the possession of the Duchy of Mantua, and adds several new Members to the College of Princes. This new arrangement, which is guaranteed by France, Russia, and Prussia, is according to the general expectation, proved to be a French Mail, and it was understood, that it would immediately receive the sanction of the Extraordinary Deputation.

General Schimmelpennek set out for Paris, from the Hague, on a secret mission, shortly after the delivery of the First Consul's message by the Minister Semoville to the Batavia Government. A French Mail has also arrived; but the Ministers, to the sole inclusive, the only journals that reached us, are, as usual, entirely silent respecting the Swiss—no proof, however, is furnished, satisfactory to the First Consul, has been received by the Patriots.

Dispatches have been received by the Minister of the Marine, from the Captain-General of Guadaloupe, announcing the death of General Kitchener, Commander in Chief of the expedition sent from France for the reduction of Guadaloupe. This was one of the most distinguished officers in the Republican service. He had established, by a series of splendid actions, a considerable reputation for courage and military skill.

Although the general tranquillity of the island has not been re-established, several hundred Negroes continue in the woods, and exercise occasionally some predatory incursions.

All the Irish and Scotch seminaries which existed before the Revolution in France, are by a Circular of the Emperor Napoleon, to be re-erected in one establishment at Paris. The funds belonging to these institutions, were long before the reign of the atrocious Republic, confiscated, and the property of the State.

By the Extraordinary Mail, arrived in the Downs, and which left Malta on the 24th of September, we received the following intelligence:—The British fleet, which was shortly expected to be evacuated by our troops. That opinion, however, was founded on a supposition, which has since been ascertained to be incorrect, and which they entertained it can hardly be supposed to have been informed, but which, we hope, would reach them in the execution, till fresh instructions should arrive from home.

It seems pretty plain, from the measures going on at home, that the Minister of the Marine, is to raise a new force in the Mediterranean—a wise measure certainly at the present moment, whatever may be the fate of Malta ultimately.

Letters from Portsmouth, received this morning, announce, that three additional ships of the line, viz. the Donagall, Hercules, and Blenheim, are ordered to be fitted for the Mediterranean, as a belated, with four months, and provisions; and that bills have been posted there, and round the neighbourhood, for entering seamen to the Penelope and Apollo frigates. Other orders for foreign service are also going on there, and in other parts of the Kingdom.

Dispatches, said to be of importance, arrived at Plymouth on Thursday, and were immediately put on board the Childer's Loop, of 16 guns, Capt. Delaford, & La Ventura brig, of 18, Lieut. J. J. Smith, which were previously victualled for four months, and sailed instantly. They had on board several secret orders, not to be opened until they get soles west of the Scilly Islands. Orders were also received for the men of war in port to visit and stand for four months, and in readiness for sea at a moment's warning. The Nimble cutter, Lieut. J. Coghlan, is ordered to complete for four months, and be ready for a start with dispatch, at an hour's notice.

A considerable number of the 31st regiment, lying in barracks at Portsmouth, have enlisted into the Royal Marines.

A curious trick was attempted to be played off yesterday at the Stock Exchange. Some persons put in Tickets at the Bank, for the transfer of Guineas into General Annesley's name, with a view of making it to be believed he was coming. The imposition was however soon detected.

On Monday last came on the election of a Mayor for the borough of Liverpool, when a very severe contest took place between James Bold, Esq. and William Harper, Esq. which lasted till 10 o'clock at night, when the numbers were counted. Mr. Bold was declared duly elected.
