On Monday last, at Martock, in the 67th year of his age, died the Rev. Mr. John St. John, of St. John's, in the County of Devon. He was born on the 15th of October, 1766, and married, in 1792, Mary, daughter of Sir Richard Rycroft. He was consecrated Bishop of Lincoln, in 1803; translated to Exeter, in 1807; and in 1820, his Lordship was moved to the see of Winchester, in the County of Hampshire. He died on the 15th inst. His Lordship was also Clerk of the Closet to the King, and Canon Residentiary of Chichester.
