### "COMPLETE SURPRISE"

#### TOBRUK MEN ATTACKED AT DAWN

Gallant Pipe-Major Who Played On

Writing from the battle headquarters inside Tobruk, Reuters' special correspondent says: "In the first light of dawn on the fourth day of the Western Desert push, British and Scottish infantry of the line, backed up by strong formations of tanks, breached out of the fortress of Tobruk. The move was so bold, so tremendous, and its secrecy so well guarded, that it was completely unexpected. The G.O.C. of the fortress told me on the eve of battle: 'Our first objective are the strongholds—'Bitch', 'Jack', 'Bill', and 'Tiger' (names bestowed on the enemy posts by the Australian troops) and the A.D.M. escarpment, where we plan to cut the new Axis road by passing the fortress and at the same time link up with the Imperial forces coming from the south.'"

### COURT REMINDER

#### Carry Own Identity Card

LOCAL CASE

The importance of people retaining their own identity cards was emphasized at West Hartlepool Police Court to-day when a man was summoned for an offence under the National Registration Act. Robert Stammer (21), of 151 Baby Road, was charged with having a false representation that he was the person on an identity card and Charlotte Barry (26), 149 Baby Road, was charged with allowing him to use the card. Evidence given by P.C. Nevins was that on June 29 he met Stammer in a field at Tinsall Hall Farm. Asked for his identity card, Stammer produced one which was neither signed nor stamped. As witness was inspecting the card, Stammer protested and then volunteered the information that it belonged to the man who had been in the field for four years. He said: "I might as well tell you I sent my card to the post in the lock, and I have been using that card to get into the shop. It is my cousin's."

### RAPID TANK REPAIRS

Ankara, Friday.—An extremely violent storm has been raging over the Black Sea for the past two days, reports an Istanbul dispatch. There have been heavy falls of snow at Istanbul. The storm had serious consequences, says the dispatch, it may have repercussions on military and air operations in the area against the Caucasus—Reuter.

### EXTRA CLOTHING COUPONS FOR OLDER CHILDREN

Last Date for Applying—10th December  
Children born on or after 1st January, 1925, and before 1st September, 1927, are entitled to extra clothing coupons. If your child is at school, he or she will get the coupons from the school authorities. If your child is not at school, go at once to the nearest Money Order Post Office and ask for an application form—a white form GC1 or a pink form GC2 if he or she has not. Read the instructions on the form carefully, get it completed, and take it to the nearest Main Post Office not later than December 10th, to get the extra coupons.

December 10th is the last day for applying for Citizens' Advice Bureau, Information Centre, or W.V.S. Council Post Office and not a Food Office.
