On Three Fronts RUSSIAN SUCCESS CLAIMS

Russian successes on three fronts—Moscow, Leningrad, and the Caucasus—were reported by Russian war correspondents.

In an offensive in the Kalinin area, north-west of Moscow, several villages have been captured, and wedges have been driven into the German lines.

Strong counter-attacks with planes and tanks near Rostov-on-Don and in the Donetz bend are reported by the Germans. News of these counter-attacks is confirmed by London and the Russians indicate that their troops have advanced in a well-fought, but unbalanced, position.

The Russians penetrated into the German lines at Leningrad by the capture of a German submarine.

AIRMEN'S GOOD WORK

The supplement to the midday Russian communiqué said: "Our airmen operating on the southern front are concentrating their main efforts on the east side of the Donetz bend, more than 300 tanks and armoured cars, 400 vehicles with war materials, nine tanks and 1000 enemy soldiers and 1000 enemy prisoners of war."
