

## 1st. Bn. THE KING'S OWN YORKSHIRE LIGHT INFANTRY.

## Short History of the Battalion from August 1914.



82/8  
Strength 33 Officers, 805 Other Ranks, including attached.

The majority of the men of the Battalion were recruited in South Yorkshire.

The Battalion was stationed in SINGAPORE on the outbreak of War, and left there 29th. September 1914 for England to form the 28th. Division which assembled at WINCHESTER 23rd. December 1914. The Battalion was a unit of the 83rd. Brigade.

The Battalion embarked for FRANCE with the 28th. Division 15.1.15, and saw service in the YPRES salient until the beginning of March, when the 83rd. Brigade moved to the WULVERGHAM area, returning to the YPRES salient early in April.

The Battalion was present throughout the 2nd. Battle of YPRES.

On the 12th. May the Brigade were withdrawn and returned to the Salient until <sup>21st May</sup> 1st. June.

About the middle of June the Brigade took over the KEMMEL sector and remained there until 26th. September. The Battalion was present during this period.

On the 30th. September the Battalion moved down to LOOS with the Division and were in action for most of the period up to 23rd. October when the Division was withdrawn preparatory to moving to the East.

The Battalion embarked at MARSEILLES 25th. October 1915, and disembarked ALEXANDRIA 1st. November where ~~th~~ a month was spent refitting and resting.

The Battalion embarked 1st. December and disembarked at SALONICA 14th. December 1915.

Up to June 1st, <sup>1916</sup> the Battalion with the remainder of the Division was employed digging the Salonica Defence Line, making roads, and a small amount of training.

On June 4th the Battalion moved up country making roads and took over the Defence Line in the STRUMA VALLEY on July 15. 1916.

The Battalion was engaged in the operations on the STRUMA PLAIN up to November 26th. The Battalion took an active part in the capture of BARAKLI DZUMA on 1st. October 1916.

On the 29th. November 1916, the Battalion, with the remainder of the 83rd. Brigade relieved an Italian Division and remained there until April 29, 1917.

From April 30, to 7th. June, the Battalion were in trenches in the DOIRAN SECTOR and returned to the STRUMA on the 19th. August 1917, and remained there until leaving the country 1st. July 1918.

During the period July 1916 to July 1918, the Battalion did a great deal of night patrol work on the STRUMA PLAIN, the patrols moving about 6000 yards out from the Outpost Line.

The Battalion suffered very heavily from Malaria and for eighteen months was considerably under strength.

The health of the Battalion is, apart from Malaria is good. There are a great number of re-current malaria cases.
