

Precis of speeches delivered by Field-Marshal Sir John French, G.C.B., O.M.,
etc., Commander-in-Chief of the British Forces in the Field, to Brigades
of the 27th and 28th Divisions on the 21st and 22nd May, 1915.

"I came over to say a few words to you and to tell you how much I, as Commander-in-Chief of this Army, appreciate the splendid work that you have all done during the recent fighting. You have fought the second Battle of Ypres, which will rank among the most desperate and hardest fights of the war. You may have thought because you were not attacking the enemy that you were not helping to shorten the war. On the contrary, by your splendid endurance and bravery, you have done a great deal to shorten it. In this, the second Battle of Ypres, the Germans tried by every means in their power to get possession of that unfortunate town. They concentrated large forces of troops and artillery, and further than that they had recourse to that mean and dastardly practice hitherto unheard of in civilised warfare, namely the use of asphyxiating gases. You have performed the most difficult, arduous and terrific task of withstanding a stupendous bombardment by heavy artillery, probably the fiercest artillery fire ever directed against troops, and warded off the enemy's attacks with magnificent bravery. By your steadiness and devotion, both the German plans were frustrated. He was unable to get possession of Ypres—if he had done this he would probably have succeeded in preventing neutral powers from intervening—and he was also unable to distract us from delivering our attack in conjunction with the French in Arras - Armentieres district. Had you failed to repulse his attacks, and made it necessary for more troops to be sent to your assistance, our operations in the South might not have been able to take place and would certainly not have been as successful as they have been. Your Colours have many famous names emblazoned on them, but none will be more famous or more well-deserved than that of the Second Battle of Ypres. I want you one and all to understand how thoroughly I realise and appreciate what you have done. I wish to thank you, each officer, non-commissioned officer and man for the services you have rendered by doing your duty so magnificently, and I am sure that your Country will thank you too."

Copy. Report on the action near LOUAVE Wood on
24th May 1915.

On the report from the Cavalry Bgde. on
our left that the enemy had broken through HOOGH
on to the MENIN ROAD I detached a company,
plus one platoon to LOUAVE Wood accompanied
by two M. Guns with instructions to hold the
Northern edge of the wood, with one M. Gun on the
Eastern edge.

I had previously sent one Company to reinforce
the 18th Hussars and three platoons to the 9th
Rangers.

About midday the Company in LOUAVE
Wood was supported by another Company - Captain
Forster being in command of the two Companies.

He was ordered to push out patrols at all
costs to the MENIN Road and if possible to
advance and take up a more advanced position.

Owing to the enemy being in buildings and
the ditches on both the NORTH and SOUTH
sides of the ROAD he was unable to get his
patrols forward. Four patrols were all shot
but one Corporal, though wounded and having
his companion killed came back and gave very
useful information. It was on information received
from this Corporal and Captain Forster that I
decided it was of vital importance to hold on to
LOUAVE Wood and to extend his left flank more

To the SOUTH to secure our left flank as it appeared
as if the enemy were working round our left rear.
Captain Forster was instructed to do this but the
OC 11th Hussars had already done this. I therefore
sent two M. Guns to take up a position covering our
left rear.

Captain Forster was given instructions to act as a
flank guard and cover any possible withdrawal of
our troops SOUTH of the MENIN Road.

The two Companies in ZOOAVIE Woods held on all
day under a heavy shell fire till the evening when
I sent orders to Captain Forster to attack the enemy
on the MENIN ROAD, dislodge him from all the
buildings and drive him back so as to make our left
flank secure, as I feared that if we delayed he
would bring up M. Guns and establish himself
during the night and turn our flank. Captain
Forster was also instructed to endeavour to get in
touch with the counter attack on the NORTH of MENIN
Road.

As soon as it was dusk Captain Forster moved
forward from the WOOD with one Company leaving
the other in support and getting in touch with the
left flank on MENIN ROAD he worked WESTWARDS
down the ROAD clearing all houses and ditches,
killing several and driving them back, at the
same time he had a patrol working down the
NORTHERN side of MENIN ROAD clearing the ditch
where some of the enemy had dug themselves in.

As the enemy retired their own men sent up flares and opened fire on them.

Captain Forsler sent out a patrol well to the North of MENIN Road but they did not succeed in getting touch with the counter attack.


Lieut Workman was in charge of the patrol and he ably seconded Captain Forsler in the attack which was quite successful.

The company afterwards returned to ZOVAVLE Woods and were relieved during the night. Our casualties were comparatively slight. Several identity marks taken off dead Germans were forwarded to the Brigade.

This detachment was the first of the reinforcements to arrive, and, though it was hastily formed into a Brigade and was composed of seven different battalions, it did excellent work from the 23rd April until it was withdrawn on the morning of the 28th April.

I much regret the loss of Colonel Geddes who was killed just as his detachment was withdrawing. I regret also that, owing to his death, and to his Acting Brigade Major being wounded, I have no record of any special services rendered by the Units of his Command. I can, however, testify to the gallant conduct of the officers and men of the 3rd Middlesex Regiment which took part in the counter-attack East of the Canal on the evening of the 23rd April.





We proceeded along the hedge running on the north side of the VIERSTRAAT NYTSCHAETE road. The idea of this


was to get up to & assault the two carts on the edge of the road known to have been used as a listening post by the enemy. We reached the carts but found them unoccupied. These carts are 30 yds from the German fire trench. We found no signs of a listening post near here. We heard digging operations near so

proceeded back along the hedge to 30

crossed the road in order to get into the field south of the road.

When in this field we proceeded along the hedge again as far as the carts but could find no one digging here but could distinctly hear it all the time so gathered it was a sap running below this road.

It was by this time 1.30 a.m. & almost light so we returned to M1. trench.


