Love and war, with love predominant, is the theme of the story, in which Lochinvar betrothed from birth with one girl, falls in love with another in the person of Helen Netherby, who is betrothed to MacGregor. After many adventures Lochinvar carries off Helen under the noses of her family.

7,500 feet. **U.**
An adaptation of the play by Michael Morton. This story, which abounds in strong dramatic situations, concerns the loss of memory of a British officer, who is invalided home and marries, not remembering a little dancer whom he had passionately loved in Paris. The dancer, now famous, comes to London with her child, and a meeting takes place. The dancer eventually sacrifices her life for the love of the man.

"Becket."

5,500 feet. **U.**
An historical romance dealing with the conflict between Thomas à Becket, Archbishop of Canterbury, and King Henry the Second. Real pages from English history, with actual locations, including Canterbury Cathedral. The story tells of Becket's sacrifice of everything he holds dear, including eventually his life, in the service of God. The cast includes Sir Frank Benson, A. V. Bramble, Gladys Jennings, Mary Clare and Sydney Paxton.

"Don Quixote."

5,000 feet. **U.**
The adventures of Don Quixote and his squire, Sancho Panza. Don Quixote feels that he is called to be a knight-errant and sets forth on his charger to rescue damsels in distress. His friends help to make a fool of him. He charges the windmill thinking it is a giant, and fights in the lists with an unknown knight who defeats him. Eventually he realises his foolishness and departs for his home.

"Guy Fawkes."

5,400 feet. **U.**
A romantic story of the Gunpowder plot, founded on history. Guy Fawkes is made to appear as a knight-errant who rescues a girl from the amorous designs of Catesby. The attempt to blow up the Houses of Parliament is shown, and also the betrayal of Fawkes and his subsequent sufferings on the rack. His bravery moves the king, who grants a free pardon to the girl and her Protestant lover.

The cast includes Matheson Lang, Nina Vanna, Jerrold Robertshaw and Pino Conti.

"The Indian Love Lyrics."

5,500 feet. **U.**
The famous song cycle made into one story of passionate Indian love. The story of Prince Zahirudin, who, on the eve of his wedding to Nadira, is led to believe that she has been unfaithful to him, and discards her. He pays court to Queen Vashti, and at the wedding feast Nadira sings and attempts to commit suicide. The prince

realises his folly, and he and Nadira are reconciled.

"One Arabian Night."

6,500 feet. **U.**
A spectacular and low comedy version of the pantomime "Aladdin," which has been largely produced as a Chinese fantasy. The Cave of the Lamp, gorgeous Chinese palaces, fairy princesses, the "Widow Twankee," and Aladdin himself, are all shown in this production.

"The Wandering Jew."

8,350 feet. **U.**
The film version of E. Temple Thurston's stage play, in which four distinct periods of history are shown. The Jew is seen in Jerusalem in the days of Christ, at Antioch, in the days of the Crusaders and in Spain and Italy in the days of the Inquisition.
